PRESIDENT TONY'S REPORT ON THE ASSEMBLY

Goals for Rotary Year 2003 - 2004

- **Membership building through a retention/recruitment program. Conduct good meetings and select good service projects to maintain membership interest.**
- **Encourage participation in service projects.**
- **Encourage participation in Rotary Foundation and HRYF.**
- **Form close partnership with District 5000, RI, sister clubs and interact club(s).**

Financial goals for 03-04:

- **Rotaplast \$1,300. (Include \$500 from special donation by Milton Miyakawa)**
- **The Rotary Foundation \$150 per person (or more)**
- **HRYF \$100**
- **New benefactor 6**
- **Major donor or bequest major donor 1**
- **Members are encouraged to donate amounts above and beyond the above goals. The needs are great, and members who are comfortable with exceeding the base numbers are strongly encouraged to do so. Many clubs achieve high donation results because a few individuals donate amounts far above set goals.**
- **We plan to find new ways to generate more funds. Our lucky drawing at each meeting is an example.**
- **New Rotarians are challenged not to wait for the old members, but to get together, find a project, and find ways to fund it. An individual with a good project not covered by the budget can still fund it himself, pool funds from other interested Rotarians, or find outside sponsors.**

COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS

· **Club Service** — Milton Miyakawa passed out Classification Survey to aid in recruiting new members and discussed the possibility of a secured website for distribution of membership information. Members were encouraged to refer speakers to Milton and his committee. Roger Lerud will look into possible options to our current visitors' banners.

· **New Generations** - Clayton Wong outlined his committee's goals in working with HBA interact, and invited Rotarians to participate in interact meetings.

· **Treasurer** - Budget for the year was disseminated.

· **Community Service** - Scott O'Brien said October 25 is the date for our annual Weinberg project, this year at the Sheridan Park, part of our Centennial project. The committee seeks nomination of qualified non-profit organizations for the \$10,000 Weinberg award. 25 members are required to fulfill project requirement.

· **International Service** - Bob Hayashi outlined his plan for sister club activities and Roger Lerud made available application forms for the 2004 International Convention at Osaka, and encouraged all to book early.

· **Vocational Service** - Candice Naito plans to continue essay contest and other vocational service projects. Her goal is three vocational projects for the year.

· **Membership Committee** - Sam Shenkus asked all members to invite a potential Rotarian to lunch. She is looking for a dozen new Rotarians for the year with a net gain of four. We will continue with the second and third visits free program for potential guests. Sam wants you to know that every member is a member of the Membership Committee.

· **Fundraising Committee** - Dave Berry outlined the committee's plan:

A MESSAGE FROM THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR

”Our team leader, Dr. Pablo Castro has identified the list of positions for the non-medical portion of the team, i.e., our D5000 volunteers (who are responsible for their own costs associated with the travel).

The positions are:

Two volunteer ward coordinators who will assist the head nurse,

One volunteer to sterilize instruments

One volunteer to interact with the children both before and after surgery

One volunteer in recovery

One volunteer assistant to the Mission Director who may be the key person on any future missions the district clubs may decide to support

One volunteer to assist the Quartermaster - another key position

One volunteer to learn record keeping

One volunteer to assist the sterilizer

I would think that there will also be need for a photojournalist to document the mission. I’m not sure what the ‘drop out’ rate will be for those unable to travel after volunteering although we should plan for the contingency and identify a certain number of alternates, especially for the key positions.

As you may recall, the approximate dates are October 12 - October 26th, 2003 and Pablo would also like to identify how many of the volunteers will plan to remain for the 2-day R&R period following the mission.

Having coordinated other missions, it’s imperative that we only consider volunteers who are SERIOUS about their commitment and not just dreaming. From my perspective, there is no room for egos either - it’s a team effort with everyone supporting the mission (may not need to be said here in D5000). From the initial interest expressed, there will probably be more candidates than positions ‘open’. Please announce at your clubs and forward potential candidate names to DQ Jackson by the end of this month <dqj@aloha.net>. If you could limit the candidates to no more than one per club as again this will be a challenging process and we want to be considerate to all the clubs.

So, all the information should be sent to us no later than July 31st. If you have any questions or observations, please contact me soonest.
