President Tony's Last Club Assembly

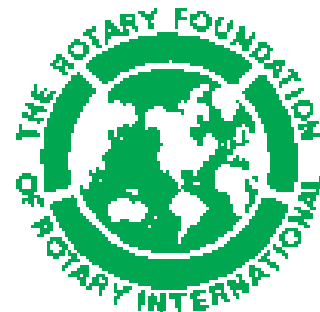

Congratulations, Zone 24 (CA, HI, NV) is number two in the world in total giving, and number one in contribution to Permanent Fund! Total contribution for the nine months ended March 31, 2004, was \$68,877,665, down 16.11% from the same period one year ago.
