The Hawaii District Conference, also known as the Hawaii State Rotary Convention was held at the Hyatt Regency Maui in Kaanapali last weekend beginning May 6th. Attendees from the Rotary Club of Ala Moana were President Tony Wong, Dave and Mary Ann Berry, Roger Lerud, and Kris Blancq.

This year's conference had outstanding speakers. We heard from Past Rotary International President Cliff Dochterman (1992-1993) who spoke about enjoying the day to day activities of Rotary and also entering the "big tent" to see the large arena of Rotary International and its worldwide projects.

Truly an outstanding speaker, Past Rotary International President Rick King spoke about club service and the duty of each Rotarian to bring in a new member. Rotary International has been asked many times, "What is Rotary going to do about world terrorism?" Rick King suggested the following three steps:

(1) Sponsor a new member to Rotary, which is the largest partnership of private and government enterprise in the entire world; (2) give \$200-300 to the Rotary Foundation to continue international projects; and (3) get involved in Rotary projects such as the wheelchair program, Polio Plus, and fighting hunger throughout the world.

WHAT IS A ROTARY CLUB?

The original Rotary Club was organized in Chicago by Paul P. Harris, a lawyer. Rotary is the oldest service club and the first meeting was held on February 23, 1905.

The name "Rotary" was chosen because the club then met in rotation at each member's place of business.

From the beginning, the Rotary idea of friendship, fellowship, and service to other has spread to six continents with more than 26,000 clubs and over one million members. Still, only one person in every five thousand is a member of a Rotary Club.

Every Rotarian has the privilege and obligation of seeking qualified members. In this way, all club members can help their clubs achieve a full representation of the business and professional life of the community.
