Tens of thousands of Rotarians in South Asia continued to volunteer their time and money toward the effort to make the region polio-free. During polio immunization activities in November alone, Rotary clubs in India and Pakistan brought their countries closer to the goal of ending the scourge of polio through massive mobilization and advocacy.

In Pakistan, more than 29 million children were targeted during the latest round of National Immunization Days (NIDs), held November 22-24, says Pakistan PolioPlus Committee Chair Abdul Haiy Khan. Reported cases in Pakistan and neighboring Afghanistan (22 and 6, respectively) are down by at least 50 percent from a year ago, according to a news update on the Global Polio Eradication Initiative's Web site.

Cases of polio dropped by 63 percent in India during the peak transmission period of August to October, according to the update. Only 25 cases were detected in 2005, compared to 68 in 2004 and 79 in 2003. Most of the cases were confined to just two states.

Overall, the drop in the infection rate is a result of the introduction of the monovalent oral polio vaccine and the level of commitment of respective governments & the Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners.

The Wheelchair Foundation has been gifting a specific amount of funds to combine with each new \$75 donation to deliver wheelchairs. It costs \$42,000 to deliver a container of wheelchairs (40-foot container) to the destination country or \$150 per wheelchair. If a Rotary Club or District donates \$21,000, the Wheelchair Foundation will use its combinable funds in order to deliver 280 wheelchairs.

Rotary International is working with the Wheelchair Foundation and their goal is to provide a free wheelchair to those who needs one, but has no means to acquire them. The foundation wants to provide 10,000 wheelchairs per month. Contact Stan Togikawa for the Wheelchair Distribution Program form.

Al Frumkin - Rotary International

Al Frumkin received his A.B. degree from the University of California, Berkeley, his lifetime teaching credential (secondary) from California State University, Hayward and his J.D. degree from San Francisco Law School. He was admitted to the California State Bar in 1971 and has been in private law practice since 1971, with offices in 3 different counties in California. I served as a teacher/administrator in the San Lorenzo Unified School District from 1967-75. Al serves as a founding Director of Granite Community Bank.

A member and past President of the Rotary Club of San Ramon, Al's Rotary involvement includes his year of service as Governor of District 5160 (1993-94). He's recognized as a trainer of other Rotary leaders; trained Presidents at P.E.T.S. , Governors at G.N.A.T.S. and G.E.T.S. He served twice as a Group Discussion Leader at the annual training of Governors in Anaheim. He also served as Representative of the President of RI (15 times) and Al has been a presenter/speaker at all levels - club, District, Zone and International, including District assemblies, P.E.T.S. and International Institutes and Conventions and in 4 countries (India, Peru, Mexico, Canada) as well as in 14 of our 50 states. Al was awarded the Citation for Meritorious Service in 2000 and named as the most Distinguished Past District Governor for Zone 23 in the year 2001-02.
