Australian Rotarians receive national honors

Seven Rotarians were among the 662 men and women on the Australia Day Honors List 2006, Honorees can now list OAM, for Order of Australia Medal, behind their names.

Honored for service rendered to the community during his 30 years as a Rotarian, Bock is chief coordinator of the Community Chest & Christmas Treasure Trove, a raffle that raises more than A\$1 million (US\$752,750) annually for the local and international projects of participating Rotary clubs, working 40 hours per week for 15 years.

Ian Slater, who was also honored, in addition to his Rotary activities, for managing the multifaceted Australian Classical Music Scholarship program.

The other Rotarian honorees are Past RI Director John G. Thorne, of the Rotary Club of North Hobart, Tasmania; Ronald Carr, of the Rotary Club of Tamworth West, New South Wales; John S. Chenhall, of the Rotary Club of Caringbah, New South Wales; Herman Eisenberg, of the Rotary Club of Sydney, New South Wales; and Brian W. Walklate, of the Rotary Club of Charlton, Victoria.
