 - 9:00 closing down the evening
3. Facilities - a. KCC confirmed; can host 300 people - No rent, but will pay the school 10% of proceeds.
4. Targeted attendees: A good question. In addition to friends of Rotary, we would be soliciting the business and F&B community.
5. Projected expenses:
 - a. Crab (1.5 to 2 pounds per person) - prepared at site
 - b. Tossed green salad - can be store bought or prepared at site
 - c. Macaroni/potato salad - do we need to cook rice? - store bought
 - d. Rolls - store bought
 - e. Dessert - either way
 - f. Paper plates and utensils
 - h. Parking/traffic control
 - i. Wine, beer, margaritas, soft drinks and water - will try to get concessions from F&B community
 - j. Auctioneer for live auction...

We don't have a handle onto the exact cost, but I can assure you that it will be significantly less than the \$40 or so per ticket sale. Revenue will be generated in 3 areas:

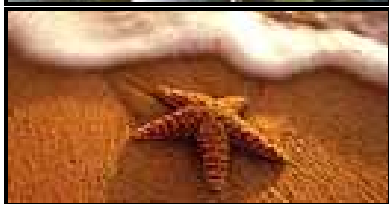
