Tony Wong's Rotary Moment

Rotary clubs and districts worldwide will commemorate [World Water Day](#) on 22 March. Water is one of RI President Bill Boyd's [emphases](#), and Rotarians are encouraged to honor World Water Day by thinking and talking about water-related problems, or better yet, initiate a water-related service projects. This year's theme, "Coping with water scarcity," highlights the importance of cooperation throughout society as well as an integrated approach to managing water resources at the international and local levels.

Rotary clubs and districts have a long history of initiating projects that help communities get access to safe, fresh water. These projects range from digging wells to implementing water filtration systems. Most recent water projects are in [Sudan](#) and the [Dominican Republic](#).

Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation E-News dated February 1, 2007

1. **HRYF Scholarship Applications** from the students is due to the Rotary Clubs on February 11, 2007. Club selection deadline is March 4, 2007, to the Island-wide (Area) selections on March 28, 2007, and The final HRYF selections will be made on April 4, 2007.

HRYF Final Selection Committee is made up of Tom Teruya, Al Bediones, Bob Moranha, Kristine Westmoreland, and Stanley Togikawa

This is a good time to remind your clubs about donations to HRYF!

2. **Donations** received from July 1, 2006 thru December 31, 2006, totaled \$48,942.13. Of this amount 2 Donations totaled over \$40,000. Since January 1, 2007, only \$2,625.00 has been received. We had a very poor participation by Rotarians to Foodland's "Give Aloha" program. Only 19 Rotarians gave a Total of \$1,652.62 (\$1,315.40 by 19 Rotarians and \$337.17 from Foodland. We received almost 25% from the "Give Aloha" program from the Rotarian donations.

4. **HRYF Life Member**, whose cumulative giving totals \$5,000: Stanley Togikawa
5. **HRYF Office** moved to the first floor on January 30th. The address is the same with no suite number and phone/fax number (735-1073) is the same.
6. **Nominating Committee** members were appointed to bring nominating for HRYF officer and trustees for the 2007-2008 year beginning on July 1, 2007: Al Bediones, Ethel Ching, and Ronald Young. Tom Teruya of the Kaneohe Rotary Club has been appointed as Vice-President – Scholarship
7. **Investment Committee** report from Cutler Investment shows HRYF's portfolio generated a total return of 13.18% (17.34% from equities vs. 15.8% from the S&P500 and 5.0% from fixed income (vs. 4.33% from the Citigroup Total Return Index). Portfolio value of \$5,279,970.
8. **HRYF Fundraising event** is planned for Sunday, April 15, 2007, at the Hawaii Theatre. This will be a premier showing of a Norbert Meisel Film of "Ray of Sunshine," featuring Nancy Kwan and Cheyene Rushing. It's a story of a beautiful young aspiring pianist abandoned by her footloose musician father at an early age. Details to follow.

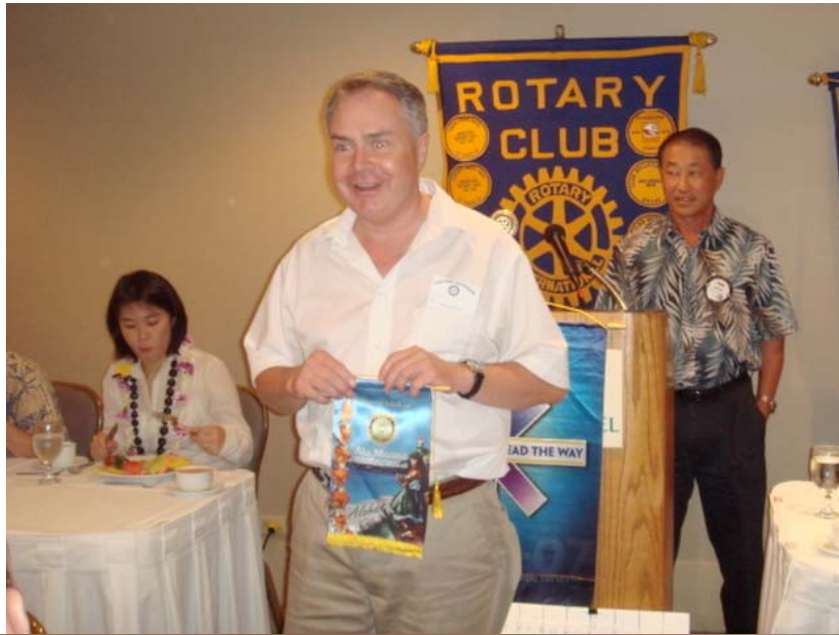

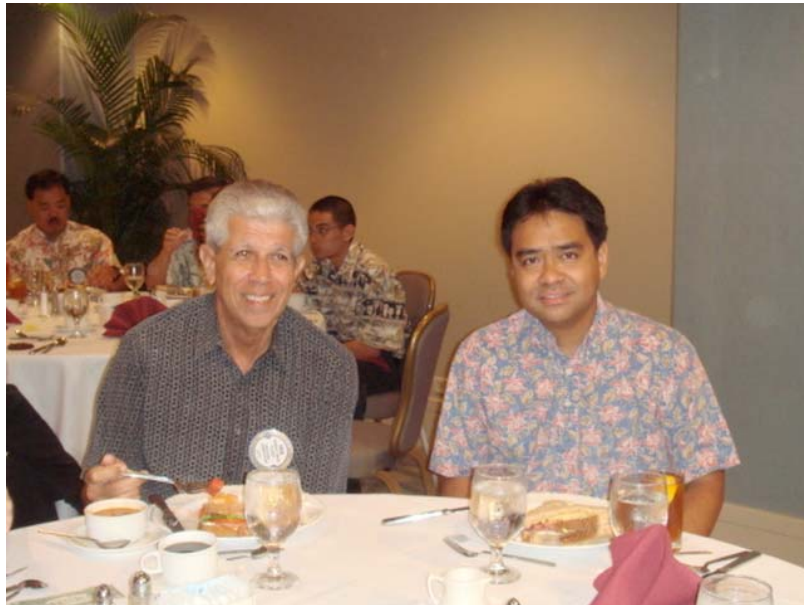
