You know that we're the HRYF club because Sully Sullivan, one of our three founding fathers, started HRYF and we're the first 100% HRYF club in Hawaii. You know that HRYF recently celebrated its 30th year. You know that our own Stanley Togikawa has assumed the presidency of HRYF.

But do you know that Gwenette Higa chaired the club selection committee and together with Sue Ann Lee, and Ben Akana, recently selected the candidates sponsored by our club? In addition to the time to gather the material and contact the candidates, the interview process normally takes a whole day.

Candidates promoted to the Area Selection Committee (four clubs constitute one area) were interviewed by Ethel Ching, Chairman, Rodney from Downtown Honolulu, Beverly from Metro, and former Ala Moana member Pat Thomas, Sunrise Honolulu, on 3-10-07. Candidates are interviewed and ranked and the result submitted to HRYF office. Setting up the Area Committee similarly involved time, and effort. In this case, Ethel Ching also personally paid for the rental of a room at Ala Moana, all day coffee service, and lunches for the judges.

HRYP funds are combined with funds from the Weinberg Foundation, and a one year scholarships are awarded based on funds available.

In addition to the members mentioned, Ethel, Kris Westmoreland, and Ethan Tomokiyo are also involved with HRYF at the administration level.

Finally, everyone of our member is a strong HRYF supporter. Your contribution keeps HRYF strong for the benefit of Hawaii's students. None of our modest Rotarians brag about their good work, or expect praises. But, you may want to tell them the next time you see them that we appreciate their extra effort. We are the HRYF club because of our combined hard work and contributions.

"PDG Hal Darcey reported the good news that District 5000 has used the allotted \$115,000 for matching grants. Unlike previous years when not all available grant funds were used, we have achieved a milestone for our district and perhaps for the world!

As you know, contributions our Rotarians made in 2003-04 were used, three years later, to fund this year's grants. \$78,500 came from Rotarians, \$115,000 from D5000, and Rotary International matched us with \$222,300. We can support 26 projects valued at \$500,000 because of our Rotarians' contribution.

Credit goes to President Elect Dave Berry who coordinated the grant submissions. Good job Dave!"

From Dave Berry: What Paul Harris Said March 11 2007

“As my Lassie Jean and I were strolling around the yard one summer afternoon, our minds reverted to the blessings which were ours. We listed our home, perched on the hill top midst friendly oaks and with evergreens in plenty to give impression of warmth when cold winds blow; we also listed books and household goods, sacred accumulations of years and representing many sacrifices.

An impulse suggested the question: Would life be worth living without these things? It did not (take) long to answer, Yes, life is even more sacred.

Then came another: Is there anything more valuable than life? We thought of (the) touch of vanished hands and the sound of voices stilled and realized that there are things without which life would be so sterile that it might well end. If there were no such things as fellowship with friends and communion with loved ones, life would be darker than starless night.

Friendship can hurdle national boundary lines, religious and political differences; and with love all things is possible.”

Paul P Harris’ Christmas Message 1930

This message was quoted, in full, by President-elect Wilfrid J. Wilkinson in his speech to the RIBI Assembly on March 4 2007.
