Hawaii Rotary Youth Foundation E-News dated May 1, 2007 – Dave Berry

1. 30th Anniversary Fund Raising Event with Nancy Kwan in attendance was successful. The Hawaii premier showing of “Ray of Sunshine” starring Nancy Kwan was held at the Hawaii Theatre raised approximately \$25,000 for the event (final report not available). The \$175 VIP Reception at the Plaza club on April 15th was attended by approximately 240 and with over 750 for the movie. Thanks to all who attended and helped with the event.

2. 2007 HRYF Scholarships selection have been awarded to 80 high school seniors from 37 high schools including 2 home school students. The total awarded was \$349,000. This year the scholarships were increased to \$2,000 for students attending Hawaii universities, \$5,000 to those attending mainland universities, and one \$8,000 M. J. Sullivan Scholarship which went to Mary Guo, a student at Roosevelt High School and will be attending University of California-Berkeley.

All the Rotary clubs interviewed the applicants, and in the final selection the students selected came from 37 Rotary Clubs. The Rotary clubs have been informed of the selections and certificate of HRYF awards were sent to the Rotary clubs to make the proper presentation to the students. It is encouraged that each Rotary Clubs invite the students for the presentation at a regular meeting, and if possible, the awards should be made at a school function.
